You should be proud of the support you provide to make this happen. Here's a great, **great** story that will make you all feel, well, **great**!



This is about a young man from the East Valley who spent seven years of his life, up until his 2020 high school graduation, going to the Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley after school since he was in the 5th grade. **Juan Antonio-Romero Velasquez** grew up in Thermal in a low-income situation. Despite financial challenges, Juan set lofty goals for himself. He credits the Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley as one of the driving forces behind his academic objectives.

"The Boys and Girls Clubs of the Coachella Valley has motivated me to achieve my career dreams," said Juan. "Club mentors guided me not only on the right path, but challenged me to take the most rigorous

path as they believed I could do whatever I put my mind to that would benefit me in the long run. The BGCCV programs like Keystone, Passport to Manhood, Athletics and especially Palabra made me mature at a young age and gave me a vision of what I could become."

Juan, who loves math, envisions a career in engineering. He would also like to double major or minor in business and agriculture. Because of his 4.2 GPA and extra-curricular activities, he was accepted by The University of California, Berkeley as an engineering student and won much needed scholarship help for the steep tuition. Even though Juan received scholarships to help him attend the school of his dreams, there would be extra costs (remaining education tuition fees, books, meals, lodging, etc.) that would be a financial challenge for him.





Two amazing human beings would, in addition, unexpectedly change Juan's life forever. Palm Desert residents **Pam and Peter McIlroy**, about a year ago, were first introduced by a friend to Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley. It was clear to them that BGCCV was a lifeline to many under-privileged children. They were impressed by the culture of caring and support shown by the entire BGCCV staff. In the past, the McIlroys had donated to schools for building projects, but were looking to help a young person without means to receive a college education that would otherwise have been out of reach.

"The Boys and Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley immediately came to mind," said Peter McIlroy. "We contacted their President and CEO, Quinton Egson, and asked if he could recommend a high school student who we could help. We were looking for a young person who was intelligent and highly motivated to achieve a better life. Ultimately, we decided upon Juan because we felt he had everything we were looking for. When we met Juan, we knew right away that we had made the right choice. We loved his contagious smile, his cheerful disposition, his maturity, and the fact that he was committed to coming back to the valley someday to help his family and community. We feel blessed to be embarking on this journey with Juan and we look forward to the day that we can attend his college graduation."

Juan was equally impressed with the McIlroys. He met with them on two separate occasions (once at the Boys and Girls Club's administrative office and once at their home). Because of their trust and belief in him, he looks forward to completing his college education and from there his career aspirations. After that, he hopes to one day give back and inspire those in financial need the same way that the McIlroys inspired and helped him.

"I would like to tell Pam and Peter McIlroy that I am extremely blessed, thankful, and honored for the opportunity to get to go to one of the best public universities in the world and to get my tuition and other costs supplemented," said Juan. "I feel so many emotions that bring me joy. I am astonished, but also excited, to know that I will not disappoint them by investing in me and my future."
