This past Friday, I had the pleasure of joining Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley CEO, Dr. Quinton Egson and staff to hand out care packages to the families that we would typically be serving inside our Mecca Club (absent COVID-19).

This was an idea Quinton and I envisioned a few weeks ago as a way to continue to serve the Mecca community. And I'm proud to say that the event was a success!

We handed out 100 care packages (containing food, masks, and educational games) to families, ultimately serving 438 community members. We had people in the parking lot waiting more than an hour before the event was scheduled. The event, scheduled to last two hours, ended after 45 minutes due to the demand.

The gratitude expressed by the families was a reminder of why each and every one of us dedicates our time to this organization.


