


We are very fortunate to partner with other community non-profits like **Old Town Artisan Studios.** We share their "shaping hearts and minds through art" philosophy and for years our Club members have been exposed to painting and sculpting. For the first time, their annual spring *Eggstravaganza* featured egg masterpieces by the Boys and Girls

Club in Mecca! Our young artists visited the studios on a field trip to view their art on display as well as participate in fun activities on the La Quinta campus! Egg bid donations will go directly to serving children (like Boys &

Girls Clubs), special needs, caregivers and more.





In March, the **Mecca Keystone** leadership Club was invited by **County Supervisor V. Manuel Perez** and the Riverside County Transportation

Department to participate in a community ribbon cutting and celebration of the new Avenue 66 bridge; one Club member delivered a speech and led the Pledge of Allegiance while others sang.

Eldorado Polo Club. They watched a tournament and then presented medals to nine young polo winners who now qualify to compete in a national event. For their community service, **Unit Director Juanita Godwin**, who accompanied the members, used the 20% proceeds (\$2,765) to buy six new laptops for her Club! Not bad for a day's "work experience."

For the past five years, I have been asked to speak at the **Youth Town Hall** (part of the annual Desert Town Hall speaker series) to selected students from local high schools, including some of our Club members. "Stay out of trouble, go to college if you can, work, study hard and <u>dream big</u>. If you do all that, you can achieve many goals in life..." is generally my message. I just learned that a Coachella Club member informed his Unit Director that he was going to the University of Florida in Gainesville specifically to study forensic pathology. When asked how the member arrived at this profound decision and career goal, the middle schooler replied, "You gave us that college book and told us to read it. So, I did." This is just

When the event committee of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley, headed by its dedicated chair of eleven years, **Sandy Taylor**, presented the annual gala fundraiser as the "grandest auction," it wasn't kidding.

Hundreds of silent auction items, lining table after table filled one large ballroom in the Hyatt Regency Indian Wells Resort & Spa the evening of March 12th. A few hours later, located in another beautifully decorated ballroom, 450 guests enjoyed dinner while participating in a live auction that included 28 prized offerings.

All the above, along with matching bid donations, allowed Boys & Girls Clubs of Coachella Valley to raise more than a million dollars to help off-set its \$3.5 million annual budget. The

nonprofit operates four busy east valley clubhouses and offers after-school programs, services and nutritious hot meals to more than 6,000 children every year. The results are astounding: 96% of club seniors complete high school and 80% go on to attend college. Many of the alumni return to give back and serve their home communities.

"We depend on contributions from fundraisers like this one, individuals, grants, corporations and foundations," said President and CEO **Quinton Egson**. "I have attended all 40 of our annual auctions, and this is probably the best of them all. It was great to see so many smiling faces. It was fitting and proper to recognize **Joan and John Foster** and their families as our Champions of Youth recipients. They are the cornerstone of our organization. Thank you to all who made the evening magical and beneficial for our kids."


