## It's all about the kids!

We are so glad to see that Covid season is officially declared to be over but, in the aftermath, we too are witnessing mental health behavioral changes at the Clubs. As we pivot to address this challenge and in keeping with our mission to save and enhance young lives, we are working with county and local mental health professionals to provide supplemental help for our Club members. The ACEs program (Adverse Childhood Experiences) trained our Club Unit Directors, and the TIC program (Trauma Informed Care) trained all staff to discern and address signs of mental health issues. Additionally, each of our four Clubs will provide weekly 2-hour onsite visits by a licensed Youth Therapist to conduct observation, evaluation, and provide referral services to members and their families.



Community outreach.

Like all Clubs, continuous membership recruitment outreach is a must. Indio Unit Director **Tracy Reed** and her **Keystone** leadership club members recently attended Indio Middle School's "Parent Night" to introduce our programs and services that focus on **character and leadership development**; **education and career development**; **health and life skills**; **the arts**; **and sports**, **fitness**, **and recreation**! With that in mind...

March is the season our graduating seniors apply for college scholarships with the aid of our educational program called **Diplomas to Degrees (d2D)**. Together with our partner **OneFuture Coachella Valley**, scholarship awards are matched up to 100%.



Teens enjoying hockey!


